PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN PRAGUE

Prague has one of the best public transportation systems in Europe.

Metro, trams, and buses are available 24/7.



Tickets and Travel Passes

Tickets are available from many newsstands, ticket offices in the metro, and from automatic machines in the metro and at selected bus and tram stops.



There is a possibility to pay by card in some buses and trams.

Ticket Inspection

Random ticket inspections can take place in the transport system from ticket officers. Be prepared to show your tickets or passes if asked.



How to reach your accommodation?

- **From the airport:** take either Bus No. 119 to metro station Nádraží Veleslavín and then the metro - green line, or Bus No. 100 to metro station Zličín and then the metro - yellow line. Or you can order an uber.
- **From the train station Hlavní Nádraží:** You are in the city centre, at the metro station Hlavní Nádraží (red line).
- **From the bus station Prague Florenc:** You are in the city centre, at the metro station Florenc (red and yellow line). Take the most suitable metro or tram to your accommodation.

WHERE TO CHANGE MONEY IN PRAGUE?

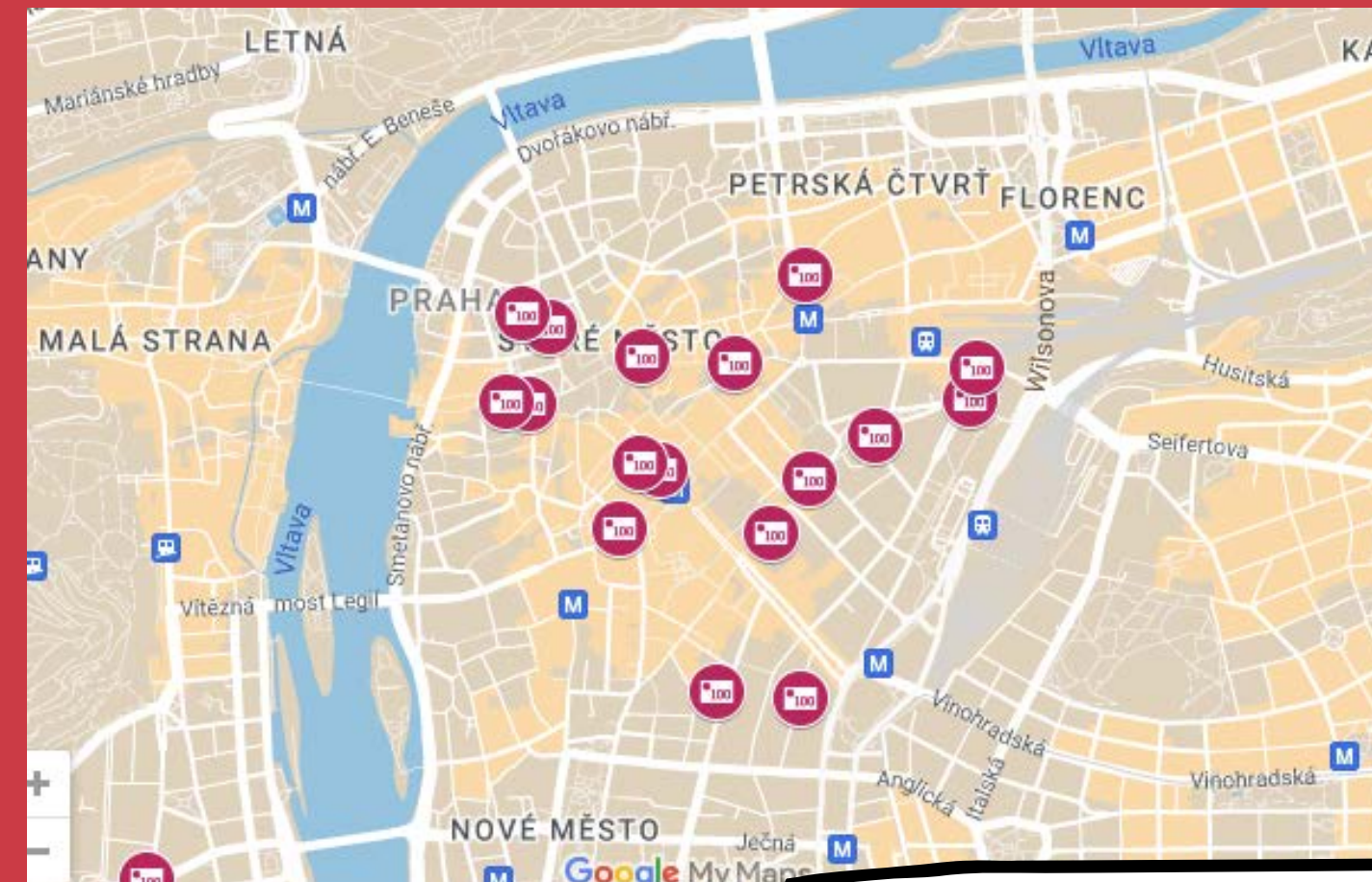
➡ There are many places where you can change money, euros, dollars, pounds or other currency in Prague, but some of them will SCAM you!

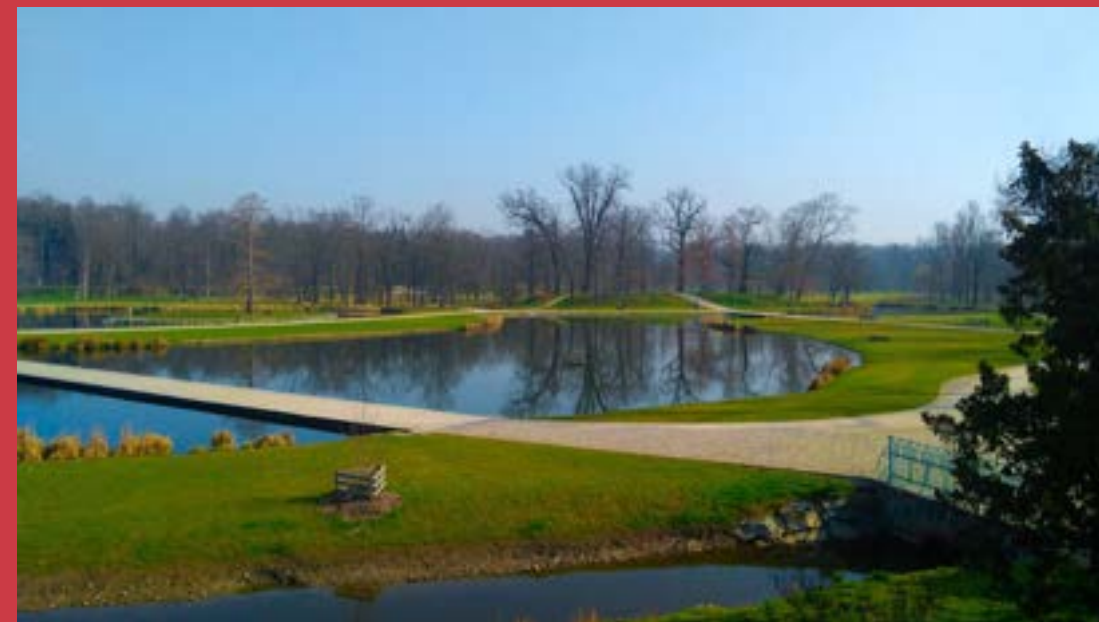
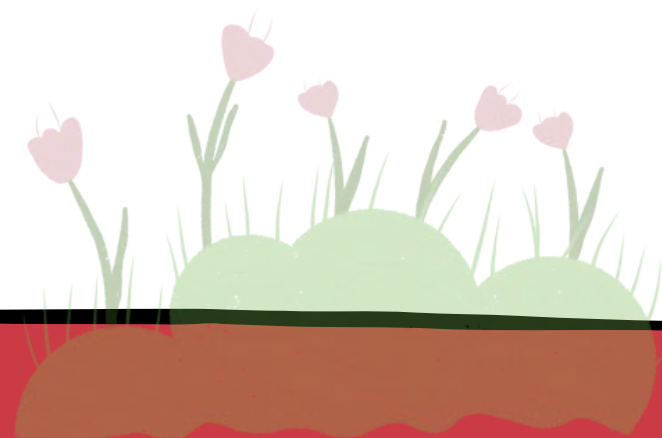

Czech Republic is divided into three regions - Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia.

The current population of the Czech Republic is about 10,5 milion.

Territory - 78 867 km² (about 125 times smaller than United States).



Did You Know?

The Czech Republic ranks as the seventh safest country to live in the world.

A Czech lunch can consist of up to 3 courses, with soup as a starter, then main course and a dessert, usually in the form of a baked buchta or koláč (cake or pie). Czechs love their soups, creamy sauces, leavened cakes and pies, dumplings, and plenty of other delicious and sometimes heavy masterpieces.

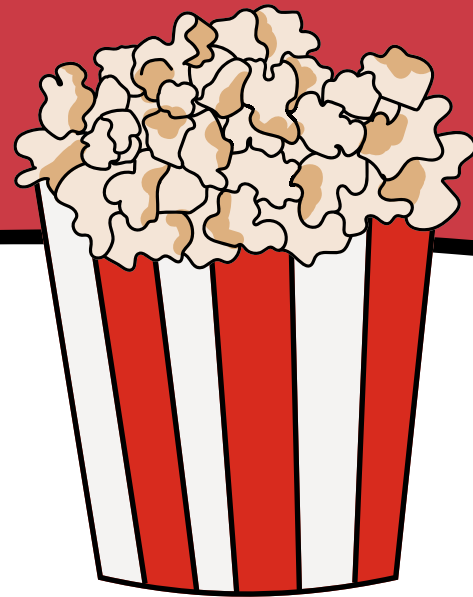
